## Scurry County Appraisal District Reminds Businesses to Render their Taxable Property by Monday. April 15

If you own tangible personal property that is used to produce income, you must file a rendition with the Scurry County Appraisal District by April 15. A rendition is a report that lists all the taxable property you owned or controlled on Jan. 1 of this year. Property includes inventory and equipment used by a business. Owners do not have to render exempt property, such as church property or an agriculture producer's equipment used for farming. "The appraisal district considers the information submitted in the rendition to set property values," said Jackie Martin, Chief Appraiser.

For most property types, renditions must be filed after Jan. 1 and no later than April 15. Different deadlines apply in certain appraisal districts. A property owner may apply, in writing, for an extension to May 15. Different deadlines apply for regulated properties.

A 10 percent penalty may be imposed if a rendition is filed late, incomplete, or not returned. Property owners who need more time to file their renditions may file a written request with the chief appraiser on or before the rendition deadline to receive an extension.
